## **Appleby College Accreditation:**

Appleby College is a member of the Canadian Accredited Independent Schools (CAIS) group, which follows a five-year accreditation cycle. The accreditation process is guided by 12 standards, each with a set of indicators used for evaluation. There are two key components: a comprehensive self-study followed by a peer review visit from a team of educators from across Canada. The visiting team will be on site from February 8–11, 2026. They will spend five days reviewing the school, AC will share feedback with the community, and identifying actions for improvement and implementation. The school welcomes inputs from parents. AC remains confident about receiving re-accreditation, reflecting the strength of its programs and community engagement.

## Discussion on Civil Discourse and Pluralism in Schools

Across North America and globally, one of the most challenging issues schools and universities have faced is how to engage in dialogue around difficult and controversial topics. These issues have deeply impacted many academic communities.

There is now a growing focus on establishing a **framework for pluralism in academic environments**—a way to foster **civil discourse** on campuses while supporting students as they explore complex issues. This framework is grounded in three core pillars:

- 1. Commitment to freedom of expression
- 2. Disciplined non-partisanship by the school
- 3. Commitment to intellectual diversity

These principles are intended to create a respectful and inclusive learning environment where diverse perspectives can be examined thoughtfully and constructively. The school is using this framework to guide discussions with key stakeholders.

#### Al Literacy and Integration in Schools

The school recognizes the growing importance of Al literacy and is committed to ensuring that students are equipped with the skills to engage with Al meaningfully. The school is currently navigating changes in this area and is actively exploring opportunities to integrate Al into the learning experience.
